Robot Bees

In recent years, scientists have been working on creating tiny flying robots that look and act like bees. These "robot bees" are being developed to help with pollen spreading. In nature, bees play a very important role in growing fruits and vegetables, because they carry pollen-yellow dust particles from one flower to another. However, bee populations have been going down around the world, so scientists hope these robots can help.

Each robot bee is very small and light. It has wings made of thin plastic and moves using a small motor. The robot bees are controlled by computers and can be programmed to fly to specific places. They use cameras to recognize flowers and sensors to collect data about the environment.
